How This Curriculum Is Organized


- ◆ <u>Text-based</u> Each unit is built around selected texts from the book of Acts, The Holy Bible, New International Version® NIV®, Copyright©1973, 1978, 1984.
- ◆ <u>Task-based</u> Meaning is at the core of language, and each focus has the learners using language in a meaningful way.
- <u>Function-based</u> Each unit also develops the learners language for every day living. The language learned in class is applicable for use outside the classroom.

How Much On-Task Time This Curriculum Provides

- The unit is most effective when the foci are done sequentially.




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MATERIALS DISK INFORMATION

Adobe Instructions for Materials CD:

- Ensure that Acrobat Reader 7 or higher is on your computer.
 Go to: get.adobe.com/reader/ and click on Get Adobe Reader.
- Place the Materials CD into your computer. Open your **Acrobat Reader** program.
- Open the file titled Developing Reading & Writing Skills. This opens to the Inside Cover Page along with a left panel of bookmarks.
- Place your cursor non the **Bookmark panel** (on the left side of the screen) and *click* **Unit 1 The Day He Was Taken Up**, to go to the **Unit 1 Title Page** or on the **Bookmark Panel**, place the cursor (1) on the plus sign (+) and *click* which will drop down a list of additional bookmarks.
- Once on the Unit 1 The Day He Was Taken Up
 Title Page, a list of the foci for the unit is visible;
 click any one of the foci and you will immediately go
 to that focus.
- When on a specific focus, click on the **Title of the Focus** and you will return to the **Title Page of the Unit**.
- On the **Content Page**, *click* wherever you see a 'pointing finger' and you will be taken to the specific unit.
- This navigation system continues throughout the entire curriculum.
- Whenever your curser changes from a 'closed hand' icon to a 'pointing finger' there is a link to another page in the file. The entire curriculum is linked for quick reference in this manner.
