Welcome to *How to Develop Listening & Speaking Skills,* a professional development course for teachers of English to speakers of other languages.

The purpose of this course is twofold:

- 2) To develop your pedagogical skill of assisting learners develop these skills by offering guidance and practical ideas for teaching and assessing listening and speaking.
