### Learning how to Teach EFL to Children Teaching and Reflecting

Before you teach	<ul> <li>Be prepared (give enough time to this phase)</li> <li>Read the whole lesson plan</li> <li>Listen to the recordings</li> <li>Repeat after the recordings at least 3 times</li> <li>Make brief notes of sequence.</li> <li>Imagine yourself teaching it</li> <li>Practice three times with the teaching aids</li> <li>Set up the classroom 15 minutes ahead</li> </ul>
While you teach	<ul> <li>Start on time</li> <li>Follow the plan</li> <li>Be confident and trust the material</li> <li>Engage the learners at all times.</li> <li>Enjoy yourself and help the learners to do so too</li> <li>Smile! Learning and teaching is fun.</li> <li>Finish on time.</li> </ul>
After you teach	<ul> <li>Reorganize your material (collect pencils, straighten tables and chairs, put your materials in the bag)</li> <li>Reflect on your session on paper.</li> <li>Write down what went well.</li> <li>Make notes on what to do differently next time</li> <li>Share your reflections with someone else.</li> <li>Plan for the next session.</li> </ul>



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
