




What Do We Know?

Instructions:

- 1. Review what the children know about Jesus: (show PPT slides) boats filled with fish, feeding the five thousand, blind man healed, Zacchaeus, story of the Good Samaritan and the Prodigal Son and Jesus is KING.
- 2. Project the King picture and ask the following questions:
 - Who is this? a king King George V
 - Who is this? our queen Queen Elizabeth II
 - What do kings do? runs his kingdom, makes rules, protects his people, battle, help people etc.
 - Are kings weak or strong?
 - Are they powerful or helpless?
 - How do they come to visit their people?
- 3. We are going to see an account of how Jesus went into Jerusalem.

- to sequence pictures according to the text
- to read and match summary statements with pictures
- to **retell** the main ideas using the pictures as cues

Jesus Comes to Jerusalem as King

Instructions:

Part A

1. Give each pair of learners a **Picture Set**. Let the learners discuss the pictures and what they think is happening in them. Then, ask each pair to predict what order the pictures will occur in the script by placing them on the table from left to right. DO NOT 'CORRECT' PREDICTIONS.





- 2. Have the learners view the video *Jesus Comes to Jerusalem as King* for **Session C1**.
- 3. After they have viewed the video, they can revise the order of their pictures, if they feel this is necessary.
- 4. View to the Audio video again. DO NOT GIVE A COPY OF THE TEXT.

Instructor Note: The Video File is embedded in the **Instructor PPT SLIDES #13**.

- 5. Have each pair of learners compare their picture sequence with another pair of learners. Have them explain the reasons for their ordering and try to come to a common agreement.
- 6. Choose a pair with appropriate ordering to retell the story in brief points showing their pictures to the class.

Triumphant Entry

Part B

- 1. Hand out **Summary Statements** to each pair of learners. Instruct the learners to match the **Summary Statements** with the pictures.
- 2. Again, have each pair of learners compare with another pair.
- 3. Play the Video again for learners to confirm the order of their statements.
- 4. Read the Statements and have the learners repeat after you.

5. Have the children turn to the **Summary Statements Worksheet** and number the statements in the correct order.





Triumphal Entry


Instructions:

1. Hand out the **Triumphant Entry Colouring Pictures** to the learners.





- 2. Discuss the pictures.
- 3. Give time for each learner to colour the pictures.
- 4. Hand out the **Puzzle Page** to each learner to find the path to the *finish*.




5. Jesus' entrance into the city on a donkey. The children sang, "Hosanna!" and greeted him with palm leaves. This **Palm Leaf Craft** is an excellent way to reintroduce children to the kingship of Jesus.

Palm Sunday Leaf Craft

Supplies: Large sheets of green construction paper. Child-safe scissors.

Directions:

- Before class cut out as many large leaf shapes as you need.
- Buy the large size construction paper if needed.
- Make the leaves long and oval shaped.
- Fold the leaves in half to make the leaf look like a tropical palm.
- When children arrive, give them safety scissors. Kids use the scissors to cut the edges making the paper look like fronds.
- Give kids crayons to write "Hosanna" on the leaves.
- Smaller children might find it fun to wave the palms at a volunteer pretending to be Jesus.
- Play the song, "Hosanna" and allow kids to worship by waving their crafts in the area.






- 1. Project the **Word List Slide**.

 - Have the learners turn to the text and circle each of the words.






- a. A **crossword** is a word puzzle that usually takes the form of a square or a rectangular grid of white-and black-shaded squares.
- b. The activity's goal is to fill the white squares with letters, forming words or phrases, by solving clues, which lead to the answers.
- c. In English that is written left-to-right, the answer words and phrases are placed in the grid from left to right (across clues) and from top to bottom (down clues).
- d. The shaded squares are used to separate the words or phrases.
- e. The answer words are taken from the text that we have read.

Triumphal Entry Skit

Instructions:

Here is a simple skit that presents Jesus' Triumphal Entry into Jerusalem. This can be done as simply as having the children read the script while acting or as elaborately with costumes and memorized lines.

Text: Luke 19:28-38

Characters:

- Narrator
- Jesus
- Owner
- Disciples (at least 2)
- crowd with branches

The Triumphal Entry Skit

(Jesus and disciples walk to the front of the room)

Narrator: He was going on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. When He approached Bethphage and Bethany, near the mount that is called Olivet, He sent two of the disciples, saying,

Jesus: (pointing to where the donkey is) Go into the village ahead of you; there, as you enter, you will find a colt tied on which no one yet has ever sat; untie it and bring it here. If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' you shall say, 'The Lord has need of it.'"

Narrator: So those who were sent went away and found it just as He had told them. As they were untying the colt, its owners said to them,

Owner: Why are you untying the colt?

Disciple: The Lord has need of it. (owner nods head in agreement)

Narrator: They brought it to Jesus, and they threw their coats on the colt and put Jesus on it. As He was going, they were spreading their coats on the road. (Jesus walks around with the donkey while crowd is praising Him)

Narrator: As soon as He was approaching, near the descent of the Mount of Olives, the whole crowd of the disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the miracles which they had seen, shouting:

Crowd: Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord; Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!
